





The Augusta Health Stroke Team implemented a recognition program that acknowledges those team members who go "above & beyond" to ensure excellent care is provided to our stroke patient population.

On behalf of the Stroke Team, we wanted to personally recognize you for your work with a stroke patient who is now enjoying a wonderful outcome. If it was not for the expertise and great teamwork between EMS, AHT, ED staff, physicians, pharmacy, and CT, we have no doubt the aftermath of this patient's stroke would have been drastically different.

The patient was brought in by EMS with stroke-like symptoms after husband found patient on floor with left facial droop and slurred speech. A Stroke Alert was called prior to arrival. The patient was seen by the physician within 3 minutes of arrival and taken to CT within 5 minutes. UVA Neurology assessed patient and t-PA was ordered and administered within 53 minutes of arrival. This patient had a + RMCA occlusion with proximal clot and was transferred to UVA for a thrombectomy. Prior to transfer, patients NIHSS = 14, upon UVA arrival, NIHSS = 16. Thrombectomy was performed with TICI 2b reperfusion. The patient overall did very well, was discharged to rehab, and is continues to improve functionally. Patients NIHSS at discharge was 3 and mRS = 3.
